NEXT MEETING - - Friday, September 22, 1971, 7:30PM.

This coming meeting will be a break from the past tradition of holding meetings at member QTHs. It is to be held at the meeting room at the American Savings and Loan Assn., 22533 Foothill Blvd., Hayward, all due to the efforts of Bob, W6RGG. We are the guests of the Savings and Loan Assn., with the meeting room available as a public service. Bob advises that we are free to make ourselves at home except that the cocktail hour, for those who desire to have one, must not be on the premises. In other words, leave your six-paks at home for this one. The S&LA fronts on A and B streets in Hayward on the west side of Foothill. The entrance for the meeting room is on the back side of the building. Go west of B st to a Hayward municipal parking lot. Turn right in the drive way of the lot, then turn right in the lot and proceed to the end. The entrance is there, as well as many parking places. From the MacArthur Freeway, take the Hayward exit and find yourself automatically of Foothill Blvd. Proceed south on Foothill for about 2 miles. The S&LA will be on the right.
