P-29 CQWW CONTEST rules

A provincial government leader in the Western Highlands of Papua New Guinea has criticised tribesmen for 'breaking the traditional rules of tribal fighting' during several recent clashes between tribes. The rules are sacred and shouldn't be broken, the Premier of the Western Highlands, Mr Nambuga Mara, said. He appealed to the national government to make sure that if tribes must fight, then they should stick to the rules enshrined in tradition.

Mr Mara, who is also a village chief, said one of the traditional rules being broken was that women, children and chiefs should not be injured or killed in tribal fights. As well, warriors were not obeying the rule that no person killed in a clash should be 'cooked or burnt'. He added: 'Another significant rule which has not been observed lately is that feuding groups are not supposed to make surprise attacks before 6am and after 5pm.'

ARRL BULLETIN NR 112 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT OCTOBER 7, 1981 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

Starting October 23, 1981, U.S. amateurs will no longer be required to give the callsign of the station with which they are in contact unless international third party traffic is being handled. Furthermore, there will no longer be a requirement to identify your station at the beginning of a transmission, so long as you identify your station at the end of the transmission or series of transmissions and at least once each ten minutes during the communication AR

CQWW CW Weekend--0000Z November 28 to 0000Z November 30.

Wow! All I can say is "Congratulations!" to each and every one of you who helped NCCC run up a total of 97 Megapoints during the SSB weekend of the CQ World Wide Contest. It looks like we'll fall a bit short of our 200 million point goal. But, we stand a good chance of reaching the 180 Megapoint mark, which would easily smash the CQ Club Competition record set two years ago by the Frankford Radio Club.

Here's the scoop. Rumor has it that the Yankee Clipper Contest Club is claiming an SSB-weekend total of 100 Meg. FRC is apparently running behind YCCC, despite getting about 60% of the 42 million point score from P41C. Our own 97 Meg tally is a conservative estimate, taking into account duplicate QSOs. So, the bottom line is: RIGHT NOW, we're tied for FIRST PLACE in the Club Competition standings.

Two things are extremely important at this stage in our Club effort. First, be sure to send in your SSB score, no matter how many QSOs you made, before the December 1, 1981, mailing deadline. The address is:

You might want to consider sending your log certified mail, with a return request receipt, to insure that it doesn't get lost in the shuffle.

Second, operate for as many hours as you possibly can during the World Wide CW weekend. Even if CW is not your strong suit, every QSO that you can make is vital to the NCCC effort.

In addition to the above list of "all-systems-go" expeditions, WB6SHD intends to be active from KH6. As well, new member WL7AOH and NCCC veteran K6BR plan separate single-op efforts from KP4. AA6UO may be on from 4X4, and, if in Canada during the CW weekend, N6CN plans activity from VE7. These five expeditions, however, are all maybes, and we should consider them as bonus points for the Club if they materialize.

The CW weekend spotting net will again be held on WR6ACZ, 147.96/.36., with K6HNZ co-ordinating net activities. The SSB net ran extremely smoothly, and a big "Thank you!" is in order to all NCS's and participants for their valuable contributions, as well as to KN6K for co-ordinating the whole thing. After the CW contest, be sure to check into the NCCC repeater, WR6ADM (147.84/.24), or on 3.815 MHz to give your score. The meeting place after the contest for our expeditions will be 21350 kHz.

Also, get those summary sheet copies in to me as soon as you can. I need them so that I can accurately report our Club score to the CQWW Contest Committee. In addition, to be eligible for any CQWW Club awards, your summary sheets for both modes must be received by me no later than December 10, 1981. If you have any last-minute co-ordination problems with the CW contest, please contact our VP/CC Rich Smith, N6KT (408-374-6123). He'll be taking over for me while I'm in the Caribbean.

Back in April, I spoke with Larry Brockman, N6AR, Co-Chairman of the CQ Contest Committee, and told him of NCCC's CQWW plans. He said, "You know, this isn't the Sweepstakes. It's the big boys' contest." Well, here we are, running neck and neck with the big boys back East. We have a chance, a real chance, to stage the biggest come-from-nowhere victory in radio contesting history--if everybody in this Club gets in there and pushes and kicks just as hard as they can. Here's a perfect opportunity to show that NCCC is NUMBER ONE in all contests, not just domestic ones. Let's do it!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!
