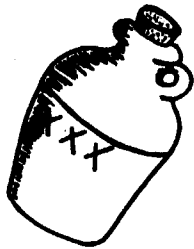

HERE IT IS, MY LAST ARTICLE AS PRESIDENT OF NCCC, AND IT HAS BEEN QUITE A YEAR! THE SCORES ARE NOT ALL IN, AND THE RESULTS ARE NOT FINAL, BUT WE DID AN OUTSTANDING JOB IN THE CQ WW; AND CAME THROUGH WITH A GREAT JOB IN SUPPORT OF NCDXC IN THE ARRL DX.

THE CALIFORNIA QSO PARTY WAS A SMASH. OUR EFFORTS AT NPG ACCOUNTED FOR MORE THAN HALF OF THEIR ARMED FORCES DAY QSO TOTAL, AND BROUGHT THEM IN ON TOP OF THE INTRA-SERVICE COMPETITION. THE "DE-EMPHASIZED" SWEEPSTAKES PARTICIPATION FAILED TO DE-EMPHASIZE OUR SCORE, AND OUR MEMBERS PLACED WELL IN MANY OTHER CONTESTS, PARTICULARLY THE ALL ASIAN.

THE SUCCESS, OR LACK THEREOF, OF ANY ORGANIZATION, DEPENDS UPON ITS' ELECTED AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS AND THE SUPPORT THEY RECEIVE FROM THE MEMBERSHIP. I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO EXPRESS MY THANKS TO THESE MEMBERS FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TO NCCC DURING MY TERM AS PRESIDENT. N6KT - AS VP/CC RICH PROVIDED THE FOCAL POINT FOR OUR MAJOR EFFORTS, AND WROTE MANY EXCELLENT ARTICLES FOR THE JUG, URGING US ON TO BIGGER AND BETTER THINGS. N6QW - AS SEC/TREAS DENNIS DID ALL THE CLUB PAPERWORK, HELPED TO IMPLEMENT A NEW MULTI-FUND ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE FOR OUR BOOKS, AND FOUND TIME TO HEAD UP THE CQP. AA6AD - BRUNO SERVED ON THE BOARD AND CHAIRED THE LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE. N6AUV - RON SERVED ON THE BOARD AND CHAIRED THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, OBTAINED RAFFLE PRIZES, SOLICITED JUG ADVERTISING, AND WAS PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL THE LEG WORK WHICH RESULTED IN OUR FB CQWW TEE-SHIRTS AND NEW CLUB QSL CARDS. K6OMB - BOB SERVED ON THE BOARD AND CHAIRED THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE. K6HNZ - KEN SERVED ON THE BOARD AND WAS ACTIVE IN OUR CQWW PLANNING AS WELL AS THE K6HNZ/CT3 AND W6XX MULTI/MULTI OPERATIONS, AND WAS THE JUG POST-PRODUCTION COORDINATOR.
